

February 13, 2018

The regular monthly meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Morrison was called to order by Chairman Tom Kempen, immediately following 2 public hearings 1) amended Public Nuisance Ordinance and 2) the proposed Fire Arms Ordinance

Chairman Kempen called the meeting to order; Those attending, Kempen, Supervisors Dennis Laabs & Jenny Wasmuth, Clerk, Colleen Magley, Treasurer, Laurie Daul, Zoning Administrator Joy Koomen, Constable, William Lasee & 9 residents/observers, Assessor Mike Denor -excused; Notice to all, Video Recording is taking place;

Pledge to the flag; moved by Kempen, 2nd by Wasmuth to approve the agenda with modification, moving item # 19 to follow # 10, m/c unanimously;

Moved by Laabs, 2nd by Kempen to approve the town board meeting minutes from January 9 & 23, 2018, with 2 additions to the Conditional use permits, m/c unanimously;

Treasurers Report, attached;

Zoning Administrators Report, attached; the Planning Board recommends leaving the RV ordinance in place; Koomen checked with the Towns of Franklin, Wrightstown and Holland officials, they do not allow anyone to park and live in RV's for a longer length of time, they need to stay in an RV park; a resident has steers on his property zoned residential; Koomen has written letters requiring him to comply with the town ordinances and he has not; Code Enforcement Officer, Mark Roberts, will take care of this;

Constable Report, none

Assessors Report, excused

Open forum for comments, resident concerned on the speed limit on Churchview Ct; another resident concerned about the culverts on Bocks Rd

Discuss/act on payment of bills, bill received for Parkview Bridge, the county pays ½ of this bill and the town is responsible for the other half; this bridge has to be replaced, the town needs to get easements; moved by Kempen, 2nd by Wasmuth to pay the bills with the addition of the previous town attorney bill for \$165.00 for a total of \$ 83,632.82; m/c unanimously;

Kempen will pick up all the town records from Attorney King and will give him the final payment; the February settlement checks were also written for \$ 1,263,749.75; these are in and out;

Discuss/act on speed limit on Churchview Ct, resident concerned there are small children living on Churchview Ct, and vehicles are notably traveling quite fast; discussion followed, suggestions for a "children at play" sign and a speed limit sign; moved by Laabs 2nd by Wasmuth to post the sign for 25 mph and post a Children at Play sign, m/c unanimously; Laabs will install the sign when the frost is out of the ground,;

Discuss/act on amended Public Nuisance Ordinance; after further review, moved by Kempen 2nd by Laabs to approve the amended Public Nuisance Ordinance, roll call vote, Wasmuth-I, Laabs-I, Kempen-I, m/c;

Discuss/act on proposed Fire Arms Ordinance; this ordinance is required for the Brown County Sherriff to enforce; the proposed ordinance is written according to state statues; the town code enforcement officer will also enforce it; Koomen has questions for the attorney, moved by Wasmuth to allow Koomen to contact the attorney concerning this ordinance, 2nd by Kempen, m/c unanimously, Koomen will report back on this at the April town board meeting;

Discuss/act on set-backs for manure pits, an ordinance needs to be reviewed, no action

Discuss/act on Brown County Tax Collection agreement, Brown County will mail the tax bills, the town will be responsible to pay for the postage;

Set date for Board of Review, Thursday, May 17, 7:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m.

Discuss/act on Town Hall maintenance/cleaning, snow removal, rental stipulations, Darrel and Diane Suchomel are cleaning the town hall and raising/lowering the flag and outside maintenance; Bill Lasee is responsible for the sidewalks to be cleaned for rentals, meetings and/or events; a property owner called to rent the town hall for a wedding for under 100 guests; the renter is responsible for the town hall and if it lasts past midnight another day rent will be required; the concrete in front of the office door lifted due to frost, the door will not open; the clerk had someone look at the floor and a possibility of installing a floating floor; will wait on an estimate;

Discuss/act on bid notice for hauling from Recycle center the hauling notice will be posted in the paper, on the website and around town; Bids will be due March 8, the current hauling contract expires April 1, 2018;

Discuss/act on action on uncovered loads at the recycle center; uncovered loads are not allowed according to the nuisance ordinance; excessive, trailer load of remodeling and/or construction materials will not be accepted;

Discuss/act on Road Bid notice for 2018, this will be published as a class 2 notice in the Green Bay Press Gazette, posted around town and on the town web site; the bids will be due March 8, 2018;

Discuss/act on estimate for work at the intersection of Wayside Rd & Dickinson Rd, discussion followed, board will meet to look at culvert work March 3, 2018 at 2:00 p.m., this will be posted; Brown County Community Event night there are free tickets for admittance to the Neville Museum, they will be set out at the election;

Review Annual Financial Report, board reviewed the report of the 2017 finances; it will be printed in a booklet as in previous years, after the recycle totals are in;

Board members report, clerk report, general community news shared by board members; board suggestions for a matter for next month's meeting repair; Laabs questioned the 40 ton limit on the Parkview Bridge and reported the street light in Wayside is working properly; Kempen shared he will pick up all Morrison records from Morrison's previous Attorney King; Koomen will review a Conditional Use permit received; Kempen explained the necessity for an O.R.I. to get the town an ID in order to obtain information regarding citations when prosecuting them in front of the joint municipal court; Attorney Parmentier sent a sample of an ordinance to Koomen; board will check the culverts on Bocks Rd;

Moved by Kempen, 2nd by Wasmuth to adjourn, m/c unanimously; meeting adjourned at 9:42 p.m.
