

## November 14, 2017

The regular monthly meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Morrison was called to order immediately following the public hearings by Chairman Tom Kempen; Those attending, Kempen, Supervisors Dennis Laabs & Jenny Wasmuth, Clerk, Colleen Magley, Treasurer, Laurie Daul, Zoning Administrator Joy Koomen, Assessor, Mike Denor, Constable, William Lasee & 7 residents/observers;

Notice to all, Video Recording is taking place; Pledge to the flag;

Moved by Kempen, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Wasmuth, to approve the agenda as presented; m/c unanimously;

Moved by Wasmuth, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Laabs, to approve the town board meeting minutes as presented, from September 30, October 3 & 14, 2017; m/c unanimously;

Treasurers Report, attached; dog license are now available for the annual renewal for 2018, dogs are required to be license every year. Many residents are not following the law and are not licensing their dogs;

Zoning Administrators Report, attached;

The Plan Board reviewed the Fire Arms ordinance also the Code of Ordinances; these will need public hearings possibly in January 2018;

Assessors Report- Mike is currently reviewing sales and assessment's;

Open forum- comments on the firearms ordinance, suggestions for a map to define the hamlets; ½% sales tax will begin for Brown County, may be used for bridges, highways; comment- hopefully some could be used for Way-Morr Park;

Constable Report-nothing to report

No budget amendments needed; Discuss/act on payment of bills, bills reviewed, after further discussion, moved by Kempen, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Wasmuth to pay the voucher presented for \$ 64,624.55 m/c unanimously;

Discuss/act on operator license application, both have no issues in the background checks, after further discussion, moved by Kempen, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Laabs to approve the operator license for Jacqueline Theisen and Erin Rose, m/c unanimously;

Discuss/act on Fire arms ordinance, discussion followed, the Planning Commission will review again and look at maps for the ordinance and definitions

Discuss/act on town attorney information & information from another attorney and his fire arms ordinance information; Attorney Matt Parmentier send information and examples for a fire arms ordinance; he is moving back to Brown County and would be interested in helping out our town; this will be added to the December agenda;

Discuss/act on uncovered loads coming to the Recycle Center, repairs to center, will need to check on littering ordinance, Laabs will check the state statutes; Daul has a letter prepared to give out to everyone checking in at the recycle center to inform them that all loads need to be covered or citations may be issued in 2018, this may serve as a warning; The guards should be policing this; parking on both sides of the road is an issue; may need "No Parking this side of street" signs; there also should not be construction, demolition items being brought to the center, they need to go directly to the land fill; the guard shack employees need to enforce this and send them away if there are a lot of construction and/or demolition materials hauled in;

Discuss ATV ordinance for Morrison, currently Morrison has no ordinance for ATV's, the Zoning Administrator, Koomen, will check into this

Discuss Joint Municipal Court; rates continue to rise for the town; Morrison has never received any reimbursement for citations; As of Jan 1 2018, the town will have Code Enforcement officer Mark Roberts to issue citations if needed; Board will need to appoint Roberts and Recycle center guards to issue citations; If Morrison wants to leave the Joint Municipal Court it needs an exit strategy, this will be on the agenda July 2018;

Discuss/act on memo of understanding between Brown County and Morrison for statewide voter registration (WISVOTE) after further discussion, Kempen signed the document with Brown County for SVRS for 2018;

Kempen opened the Public Hearing for the proposed 2017 levy payable in 2018; Kempen explained the tax rate for Morrison is down but the equalized value is up this means less money for roads and other expenses; no comments from the public hearing;


Kempen closed the public hearing for the proposed 2017 levy payable in 2018 and called the Special Town electors meeting to order;

Discuss/act to approve the 2017 proposed levy payable in 2018 of \$466,144.00; moved by Koomen, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Wasmuth to approve the 2017 proposed levy payable in 2018 of \$466,144.00, m/c unanimously; Moved by Kempen, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Koomen to adjourn the special town electors meeting, m/c unanimously;

Approve the 2017 proposed levy payable in 2018 of \$466,144.00, moved by Kempen, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Laabs to approve the levy of \$466,144.00 m/c unanimously;

Board members reports/comments: there is a sign down on NN & Wayside Rd, Laabs will look at a damaged culvert on Queens Rd to see if it is plastic; Wasmuth reported there is road damage on River Rd just south of Hill Rd possibly from Manure tankers, damage was seen within hours of the manure tankers driving on River Rd; another town requires the haulers to apply a base on the road before any manure hauling is set up; report that other towns may add a fee per acre to the farmers hauling manure for road repairs; the trading post has not posted any parking signs, Wasmuth will look into this; the old alcohol plant is starting to be cleaned up; Kempen will contact the county about the 4-way STOP signs in Wayside; Lasee is still trying to get an estimate to fix the recycle center gate, Rabas will send us the bill for ditch cutting for next meeting; Kempen reported, Morrison is accepted for a TRIP Road which will be Bocks Rd; we will receive reimbursement of approximately \$14,000.00 the road needs to be repaired in 2019; the culverts on Bocks Rd will need to be looked at before repairs will start; Someone is dumping tires in a creek. Glenmore got them out the first time and paid for it, now the 2<sup>nd</sup> time it happened hauling will come out of the budget;

Moved by Kempen, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Wasmuth to adjourn; m/c unanimously, meeting adjourned at 9:36 p.m.
