

(15) "PP" means polypropylene containers marked by the SPI code No.5.

(16) "PS" means polystyrene plastic containers marked by the SPI code No. 6.

(17) "PVC" means polyvinyl chloride plastic containers marked by the SPI code No. 3.

(18) "Recyclable materials" includes lead acid batteries; Major appliances; waste oil; yard waste; aluminum containers; corrugated paper or other container board; foam polystyrene packaging; glass containers; magazines; newspapers; office paper; plastic containers, including those made of PETE HDPE, PVC, LDPE, PP, PS, and mixed or other plastic resin types; steel containers; waste tires; and bi-metal containers.

(19) "Solid Waste" has the meaning specified in s. 144.01(15), Wis. Stats.

(20) "Solid waste facility" has the meaning specified in s. 144.43(5), Wis. Stats.

(21) "Solid waste treatment" means any method, technique or process which is designed to change the physical, chemical or biological character or composition of solid waste. "Treatment" includes incineration.

(22) "Waste tire" means a tire that is no longer suitable for its original purpose because of wear, damage or defect.

(23) "Yard waste" means leaves, grass clippings, yard and garden debris and brush, including clean woody vegetative material no greater than 6 inches in diameter. This term does not include stumps, roots and shrubs with intact root balls.

1.11 Separation of Recyclable Materials. Occupants of single family and 2 to 4 unit residences, multiple-family residences, and non-residential facilities and properties shall separate the

following materials from postconsumer waste:

- (1) Lead acid batteries
- (2) Major appliances
- (3) Waste oil
- (4) Yard waste
- (5) Aluminum containers
- (6) Bi-metal containers
- (7) Corrugated paper or other container board
- (8) Foam polystyrene packaging
- (9) Glass containers
- (10) Magazines or other materials printed on similar paper
- (11) Newspapers or other materials printed on newsprint
- (12) Office paper
- (13) Plastic containers made of PETE, HDPE, PVC, LDPE, PP, PS, and mixed or other plastic resin types.
- (14) Steel Containers
- (15) Waste Tires

1.12 Separation Requirements Exempted. The separation requirements of s. 1.11 do not apply to the following:

- (1) Occupants of single family and 2 to 4 unit residences, multiple-family dwelling and non-residential facilities and properties that send their postconsumer waste to a processing facility licensed by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources that recovers the materials specified in s.1.11 from solid waste in as pure a form as is technically feasible.
- (2) Solid waste which is burned as a supplemental fuel at a facility if less than 30% of the heat input to the facility is derived from the solid waste burned as supplemental fuel.
- (3) A recyclable material specified in s. 1.11 for which an

variance or exemption has been granted by the Department of Natural Resources under ss. 159.07 (7)(d) or 159.11(2m). Wis. Stats., or s. NR 544.14, Wis. Administrative Code.

1.13 Care of Separated Recyclable Materials. To the greatest extent practicable, the recyclable materials separated in accordance with s.1.11 shall be clean and kept free of contaminants such as food or product residue, oil or grease, or other non-recyclable materials, including but not limited to household hazardous waste, medical waste, and agricultural chemical containers. Recyclable materials shall be stored in a manner which protects them from wind, rain, and other inclement weather conditions.

1.14 Management of Lead Acid Batteries, Major Appliances, Waste Oil and Yard Waste. Occupants of single family and 2 to 4 unit residences, multiple---family dwellings and non-residential facilities and properties shall manage lead acid batteries, major appliances, waste oil, and yard waste as follows;

(1) Lead acid batteries shall be turned in at point of purchase or replacement or delivered to the Town of Morrison Recycling Center. No broken batteries will be accepted.

(2) Major appliances shall be delivered to the Town of Morrison Recycling Center. Included in this is Air conditioner, clothes dryer, clothes washer, dishwasher, freezer, microwaves, oven, refrigerator, stove, furnace, boiler dehumidifier and water heater. Landfill disposal of microware ovens with the capacitors removed is also allowable.

(3) Waste oil shall be delivered to the Town of Morrison Recycling Center in covered containers which do not leak and are not larger

than five (5) gallons in size.

(4) Yard waste shall be managed by each individual property owner or tenant. Information on composting can be obtained from the municipal clerk.

1.15 Preparation and Collection of Recyclable Materials. Except as otherwise directed by the Town of Morrison Town Board, occupants of single family and 2 to 4 unit residences shall do the following for the preparation and collection of the separated materials specified as, 1.11(5) through (15);

(1) Aluminum Containers shall be rinsed and flattened.

(2) Bi-metal containers shall be rinsed, labels removed, and flattened.

(3) Corrugated paper or other container board shall be flattened and bundled as to not fall apart upon transport. All plastic liners must be removed from cereal boxes.

(4) Foam polystyrene packaging refer to variance. When variance is lifted it will be collected.

(5) Glass containers shall be clean and color separated. No light bulbs, window panes, mirrors, etc. No broken glass will be accepted.

(6) Magazines or other materials printed on similar paper shall be bundled or put in brown grocery bags.

(7) Newspaper or other materials printed on newsprint shall be bundled or put in brown grocery bags.

(8) Office paper shall be bundled.

(9) Plastic containers shall be prepared and collected as follows;

(a) Plastic containers made of PETE, this consists of soda bottles shall be clean and flattened.

(b) Plastic containers made of HDPE, this consists of milk
